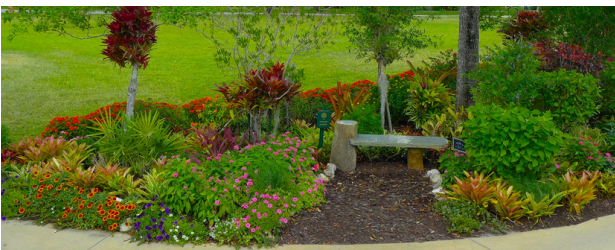




AVERAGE ANNUAL BUDGET:

OUR GARDENS

Location

The Butterfly Gardens are located within the one mile long Native Buffer Zone on the south side of VillageWalk. Gardens 1 to 4 are between Wahoo and Vermillion, while Gardens 5 to 10 are between Scrub Jay and Queen Angel. The sidewalk along the Gardens has benches at regular intervals and is accessible to golf carts, making it ideal for the handicapped to visit. So, sit, listen and enjoy the flowers and the many creatures they attract.

History

The Butterfly Gardens are a major project of the VillageWalk Garden Club (VWGC). Started in 2014 and incorporated as a Florida non-profit organization in 2015, the Club registered as a 501 (c) (3) charitable corporation in 2017. The Gardens have the guidance and support of the Bonita Spring Community Development Department. Over the years, the Gardens have grown from a few square yards to 2.5 acres, and are divided into 11 individual Gardens.

The Hive

Most of the work in the Butterfly Gardens is done by volunteer VillageWalk residents who are members of the VillageWalk Garden Club. Over the years, the number of gardeners (our "worker bees") has grown to over 50 strong. They are guided by the Butterfly Garden Chairwoman (the "Queen Bee"). An aging population and a hotter climate have led to the need for paid outside laborers for the harder physical tasks.
